SPOTLIGHT ON SCHOOLBOY RUGBY

After two consecutive years of cancellation, Noël Ingle, chairman of the SA Schools Rugby Association, is eager to see the resumption of the Standard Bank Kearsney Easter Rugby Festival, and a degree of normality to the schoolboy rugby calendar this season.

Following the pandemic-related havoc wreaked on South Africa's schoolboy sporting plans, 2022 finally welcomes the return of Kearsney's prestigious celebration of rugby. And while the ramifications of COVID-19 will naturally be felt within the game's school systems, Ingle is focused on the tantalising prospect of a return to play.

"I've already watched quite a bit and it seems everyone is in the same boat; but what has stood out is the huge enthusiasm. I've noticed a high percentage of kids who really want to get out and play sport and do activities; they've missed it," he says.

"It does look as though numbers of players actually playing rugby at school level are down this year... schools seem to be fielding fewer teams. We won't know the full impact until we're further into the rugby season and have had an opportunity to watch play."

Ingle, who also acts as senior vice president of the KZN Rugby Union and headmaster of Glenwood Preparatory School, highlights the areas of the schools' game that will require the most focus.

"There are probably two age groups of schoolboy rugby players who have missed out the most over these two years. Those who were in Grades 1 and 2 during COVID and are now in Grade 3, having their first exposure to rugby at school. And those who were in Grades 6 and 7, and are now playing high school rugby for the first time. This could be quite a challenge for them. We're hoping the evident enthusiasm will outweigh this."

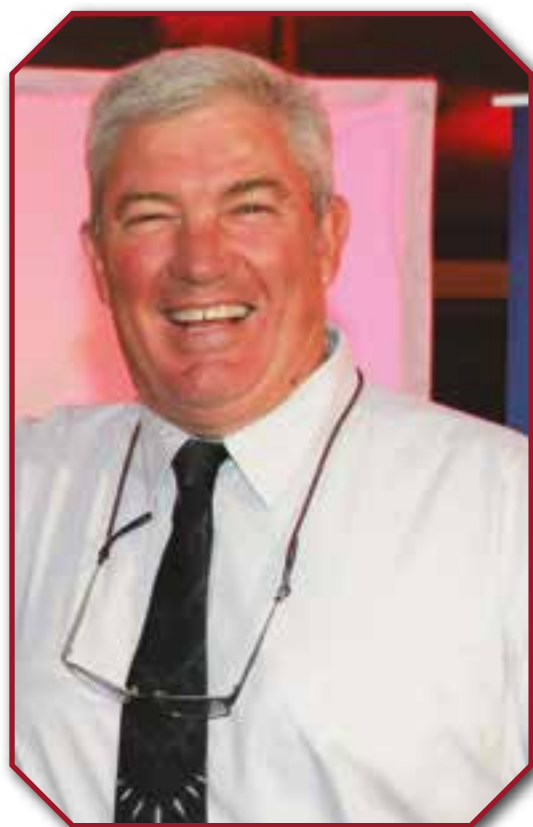
There is light at the end of the tunnel, though, and Ingle reckons things will slowly begin to work themselves out – especially with the Youth Weeks back this year.

"I believe the appetite to play sport will be huge this season, and most issues will self-correct through this enthusiasm and the dedication of school coaches," he says.

"The inter-provincials (Craven and Academy Weeks) are happening – it's essential they do. School tournaments are largely happening too, but finance could be an issue, with sponsorship more difficult to secure. Challenges are anticipated where travelling players test positive, but organisers are putting protocols in place to cope with this.

"There have been a lot more high performance activities around the country – going to schools, asking them to identify talented players and then getting these boys together. As with other festivals, KERF will be a hive of activity, with lots of eyes out and SA Schools selectors watching for players displaying talent and skill.

"It's great that schools like Kearsney have stood up and are hosting tournaments of this nature – to get rugby played again at competitive level. To those schools, to the staff, to the volunteers for ensuring schoolboy rugby is being played: Thank you."



KEARSNEY EASTER RUGBY FESTIVAL 'HALL OF FAME'

Since the inaugural festival in 2008, numerous schoolboys who played at KERF have gone on to light up the pro rugby scene at home and abroad. Here are just a few.

LUBABALO 'TERA' MTEMBU

School: Dale College | **KERF Years:** 2008, 2009

The talented Tera donned the colours of Dale at the inaugural KERF in 2008 and returned to lead his school a year later. The dynamic eighthman went on to captain the Sharks for the first time in the 2014 Currie Cup and bagged 47 Super Rugby caps for the men in Black and White. He had a brief stint in the US with the New England Free Jacks in Major League Rugby, before hanging up his boots in January this year. He is currently a rugby coach at Kearsney.

JOHAN GOOSEN

School: Grey College Bloemfontein | **KERF Year:** 2010

Regarded by many as the most talented schoolboy this country has ever produced, Goosen burst onto the Super Rugby scene with the Cheetahs after school and debuted for the Springboks in 2012 at just 21 years of age. Sojourns at Racing 92 and Montpellier followed before he was snapped up by Bulls coach Jake White last year.

PAUL WILLEMSE

School: Hoërskool Monument | **KERF Year:** 2010

A 2012 Junior World Championship winner with South Africa, 127kg second rower Willemse became a Grand Slam champion with France during their successful Six Nations campaign this year. The 29-year-old Montpellier man has established himself as one of Europe's toughest tight forwards and will be key in his adopted nation's pursuit of World Cup glory in their own backyard next year.

SIVIWE SOYIZWAPI

School: Dale College | **KERF Years:** 2010, 2011

The current Springbok Sevens skipper represented Dale College at the 2010 and 2011 editions before going on to join the Eastern Province Kings Academy after school. Following brief stints with the Southern Kings and Stormers, 'Shakes' turned his full attention to the seven-man code and has been an integral cog in Neil Powell's well-oiled Blitzboks machine ever since.

WARRICK GELANT

School: Hoërskool Outeniqua | **KERF Year:** 2013

Gelant became Outeniqua's fourth Springbok when he debuted against Wales in Cardiff in 2017 and went on to lift the Rugby Championship and Webb Ellis Cup two years later. After spending the majority of his playing career in Pretoria at the Bulls, he made the move to the Cape and has been electric for the Stormers this season.

KHUTHUZANI MCHUNU

School: Glenwood High School | **KERF Year:** 2015

A regular in the Sharks' United Rugby Championship (URC) squads this season, Mchunu, who hails from Greytown, turned out at KERF for the Green Machine in 2015. The 24-year-old tighthead debuted for the Sharks three-years later, and enjoyed a short period at the Cheetahs before returning to Durban where he has become an important player in a Sharks side gunning for a home playoff berth in the URC.

APHELELE FASSI

School: Dale College | **KERF Years:** 2016, 2017

The 'Weekend Special' was schooled at Dale and earned a Sharks Academy Bursary in 2016 for his outstanding performances at KERF. He's since established himself as one of the Sharks most valuable players and earned his first two Test caps during the Springboks' 2021 international season. On the basis of his displays in the URC so far this season, it's fair to say he will add to that tally this year.

SIBUSISO SANGWENI

School: Kearsney College | **KERF Years:** 2017, 2018

One of Kearsney's very own. Loose forward Sangweni played at KERF in 2017 and 2018, before gaining selection to the SA U20 side in 2019. The talented youngster currently represents the Lions in the URC, having made the move to Johannesburg last year.

DR EG JANSEN

A physical brand of rugby is played at this Boksburg school which prides itself on being one of the toughest East Rand sides, regularly taking on the biggest schools in Gauteng. Hoërskool Dr EG Jansen has a long and illustrious rugby history, having been the Valke league champions on multiple occasions, as well as winning the coveted Nupower and Beeld trophies in 2013. It has a rich rugby history, with players like Francois Uys (Free State), Louis Ludick (Sharks), Kevin Buys (Lions) and Ruaan Lerm (Lions and EP Kings), Gunter Smuts (Lions), JP Du Preez (Cheetahs and Sale Sharks) and Erich Cronje (Zebre) having gone through its ranks. In addition, the school has many Craven Week players on a consistent basis, with old boys Hendré Stassen (Bulls) and Nico Peyper (Bulls) being awarded SA Schools colours in 2015.

PRECISION PREPARATIONS

The Standard Bank Kearsney Easter Rugby Festival is a mammoth organisational endeavour for which planning usually starts soon after the previous one ends, in order to ensure a memorable experience for nearly 500 players and their support staff, as well as the thousands of spectators expected to converge on Kearsney College over the Easter weekend.

Hopeful that COVID-19 regulations would be relaxed in time for this year's festival, preparations of The Stott rugby field started in September last year with aerating the ground to improve drainage, monthly scarifying, twice-weekly cutting, fertilising, top dressing with 70 tons of a sand-soil mix, applying of treatments and regular watering using grey water.

Once rugby season commenced, divots and kick outs were refilled and dangerous foot holes patched and levelled each day after games and practices to protect ankles. The field was hand-weeded rather than sprayed with herbicides, and a biological foliar feeding application was applied weekly, to help condition the soil and to reduce chemical inputs on campus. Kearsney is one of only a few schools using this green-focus programme.

Careful preparation of the pitch to withstand KERF's heavy compaction is critical, since more matches are played on Kearsney's Stott field over the festival than are played on Durban's Kings Park during an entire season.

The Stott is nurtured by Cliff Hunter, facilities and projects manager at Kearsney, together with his team of 22 gardens and grounds staff and 34 cleaning and maintenance staff, to deliver a superb field and campus for the festival.

The country's top rugby-playing schools don't travel lightly, with each squad having 25 players as well as a variety of support staff - from head, forward and backline coaches, to managers, physiotherapists, biokineticists, conditioning coaches and analysts.

All 12 senior sides, their support teams and the KZN Rugby Union's U13 development team are accommodated in the College's modern dormitories and eat in the school dining halls for the duration of the festival.

Ensuring these hungry bodies are satisfied is no light matter. The shopping basket to feed them for the weekend includes 960 dozen eggs, 500kg of chicken fillet, 425kg bananas, 150kg tomatoes, 250 heads of lettuce; and the school's on-site bakery will produce about 2 300 fresh bread rolls daily. Kearsney also has an on-site butchery where its legendary boerewors is prepared, said by many to be a serious contender for the annual national boerewors competition!

Taking it effortlessly in her stride and heading up the catering team is Sigrid Ceronio from the Empact Group. Together with 33 catering staff members, they prepare 6 000 meals over the Easter weekend, ensuring the players' dietary demands are well catered for.

DURBAN HIGH SCHOOL



Founded in 1866, DHS is a traditional boys' state school, steeped in history and tradition, and known for producing leaders in all walks of life. DHS began playing rugby in 1910 when Maritzburg College old boy AS Langley became headmaster and banned soccer, forcing all boys to play rugby. DHS has produced some notable rugby legends, including Skonk Nicholson and Springboks Neville Todd (1928), Andrew Aitken (1997), BJ Botha (2006) and Alistair Hargreaves (2009). Several players have represented other countries: Greg Rawlinson (New Zealand), Antonie Claassen (France), Graham Downes (USA), Matt Alexander (USA), Wynston Cameron-Dow (Germany) and Senzo Ngubane (Germany). Provincial players include Skonk Nicholson, Jody Jenneker, John Slade, Luzuko Vulindlu, Garth Williamson, Greg Hamilton, Anton Bresler, former DHS 1st XV coach Scott Mathie and, more recently, Phendulani Buthelezi, Celimpilo Gumede and Sanele Nohamba.

WORLD-CLASS SPORTZONE

The multi-functional SportZone at Kearsney College is a world-class facility with state-of-the-art equipment which allows for scientific coaching to take place, regardless of the weather.

It consists of an indoor centre equipped with seven indoor cricket nets, four bowling machines, two basketball courts, indoor hockey/ soccer pitches, change rooms and a viewing deck; a large and modern fully-equipped gymnasium and two swimming pools (one of which is heated).

The cricket nets allow for a full bowling run-up, with special cushioning in the delivery stride area to prevent injury. The size and surface of the basketball courts are of international standard and the area doubles as an indoor hockey and soccer pitch out of basketball season.

The 280m² high performance weights gym is air-conditioned and equipped with a modern free weights section, a timed circuit training facility and state-of-the-art cardio-vascular equipment: treadmills, spinning bikes, rowing machines and boxing bags. Training takes place under the supervision of a qualified biokineticist.



The SportZone complements the High Performance Sports Programme (HPP) offered by Kearsney and allows for scientific coaching to take place whatever the weather. The HPP, with personalised fitness and conditioning programmes and individual attention from specialists in a variety of fields, including physiotherapist, biokineticists and dieticians, ensures that talented sportsmen can be superbly looked after and conditioned, enabling them to achieve their potential.

Kearsney is committed to providing a holistic education and views sport as an essential component of a broad and integrated approach to education and wellness; and believes that participation in sport is integral to a boy's personal development.

The College has a policy of "sport for all" and promotes a culture of fair play and respect.

Sporting excellence, participation and fun are the cornerstones of Kearsney's approach to sport.

ENGLAND, BRITISH & IRISH LIONS
AND SARACENS RUGBY CAPTAIN

*chats about rugby, retirement,
coffee and family*

A true Kearsney College all-rounder, Brad Barritt was head prefect of Pembroke House, captained his school 1st XV in 2004 whilst also playing 1st X1 cricket; was selected for Craven Week, SA Schools and Sharks U19 whilst at school; and achieved five distinctions in his final Matric examinations.

Kearsney coaches describe Brad, who played hooker until U15 level when he switched to centre, as "a most intelligent rugby player. His commitment and discipline were exemplary and he always put in extra time and effort". Talent and determination ensured his well-deserved opportunities.

Before retiring from professional rugby in 2020, Brad brought his London-based Tiki Tonga Coffee Roasters to South Africa, with the first two outlets in Umhlanga and Melrose Arch. Inspired by his mutual love of coffee and sport, Tiki Tonga is completely natural, with no additives, preservatives or the sugars used in sports drinks.

As a youngster, who was your sporting idol?

I always admired Andre Agassi and his tenacious attitude on the tennis court.

Who is the toughest opponent you've played?

In my first season of pro rugby, I got to play against Tana Umaga who was an exceptional player and leader.

And the toughest tackler?

I got on the wrong end of a Bakkies Botha clear-out once, and it took some time to get my lungs back! All Black player Jerry Collins was another force to be reckoned with.

Who's the best captain you've played under?

I've had two captains I loved playing under. John Smit in my early years at the Sharks and Steve Borthwick in my early years at Saracens. Both completely different as leaders, but they symbolised to me that the best leaders are true to themselves.

What advice would you give the young Brad Barritt playing rugby at Kearsney?

Enjoy every minute playing with your friends, as those are special moments you will never forget.

What are some of the highlights of your rugby career?

My first international cap for England against Scotland in 2012 and beating New Zealand at Twickenham later that year.

My first premiership title in 2011 was special. And winning the European Champion Cup in 2016, shortly followed by the Premiership and ultimately the double title.

Touring with the British Lions in 2013 was another incredible experience.



Did you have any personal traditions/superstitions before playing?

I had a similar structured warm-up pre game for 15 years. And I also had a certain pre match meal. Nothing special - chicken pesto pasta.

Winning RWC in 2019 put SA in a euphoric state and Siya Kolisi has become a national icon across the communities. What was it like watching from your vantage point?

It was an incredible victory for South Africa, and Siya's story has undoubtedly had a huge impact on society, and hopefully will continue to encourage the next generation, that anything is possible. On the flip side I was disappointed for my very good friends in the England team, some who had been my team mates at Saracens and England for over 10 years.

Is it true you had a traditional Big Greek Wedding, complete with plate breaking?

Yes, it was a fantastic occasion and a night I will never forget. My wife Giorgia's dad is Greek Cypriot.

What has fatherhood meant?

It's been the best thing to happen to me. Leo (seven next month) and Noah (nearly two) have changed our lives for the better and given me fantastic perspective. And in turn, I think helped me as a professional.

Tell us about Tiki Tonga - how did it come about?

Tiki Tonga Coffee was a passion project which I founded after I completed my MSc in Business Management. Tiki Tonga is a victory song, sung across the UK, which was brought over from New Zealand - it represents passion and joy. Our brand is inspired by sport and strives to bring people together, through coffee.



Kearsney rugby history was made in 2012 when two Kearsney College old boys - prop Matt Stevens (KC 2001), left, and centre Brad Barritt (KC 2004) - were selected for the England squad to play in the Six Nations against Scotland at Murrayfield, Edinburgh; here holding the Calcutta Cup following their team's victory. They were both also selected for the British & Irish Lions. Matt remains Kearsney's most capped player, having played in the 1st XV for four seasons, and as captain in 2000 and 2001. He was head of Sheffield House, as well as head of the acclaimed choir.

Any plans you have to take it wider than the UK and SA?

We currently ship worldwide with customers across 45 countries; especially since we launched a collaborative coffee with Guinness - our 232 Brew (contains no alcohol) www.tikitonga.co.uk We are also the official coffee supplier of Tottenham Hotspur and their world-class stadium; and have partnerships with pro sports teams and organisations such as Saracens, Tough Mudder, Lords Cricket Stadium and the Tour of Britain Cycling Event.

How are your South African outlets doing?

The Umhlanga Tiki Tonga branch is going very well. The secret is the fantastic staff and baristas who have echoed our message: sport, health and exercise but, more importantly, fun. The Tiki Run is now a well-established Wednesday morning running club in Umhlanga, which attracts over 100 runners. We have a second store in the Melrose Arch Precinct in Johannesburg which is also doing well; and recently opened on the beach at Dunkirk Estate, just north of Ballito. We're scheduled to open in Cape Town in a couple of months.

What are you doing now that you're back in South Africa and no longer playing professional rugby?

I'm managing director in Africa of UK-based Pollinate, a software business which provides digital data to assist small businesses connect to banks.

Hoërskool Monument (Monnas) has a rich and proud history. It was established in 1921 in Krugersdorp, with just 48 pupils and three staff members. This year Monnas turned 101 years old, and now has 1 600 learners and 18 rugby teams. The first school rugby match was played in 1922 against Krugersdorp High School. Since 1936 the Monnas 1st XV has played in white jerseys, black shorts and black socks, with the Paardekraal Monument as the crest on its jersey. From 1979, Monnas' first team has been known as the Wit Bulle. Monnas is proud of its nine Springbok rugby players: Christo Wagenaar, Brendan Venter, Jaque Fourie, Jorrie Muller, Heinke van der Merwe, Willem Alberts, Jaco Taute, Julian Redelinghuys and Ruan Dreyer. Four old boys have also represented international teams: Gert Peens (Italy), Quintin Geldenhuys (Italy), Paul Willemse (France) and Jaco van der Walt (Scotland).

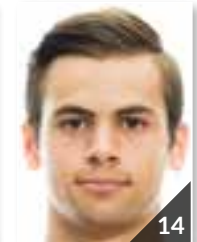

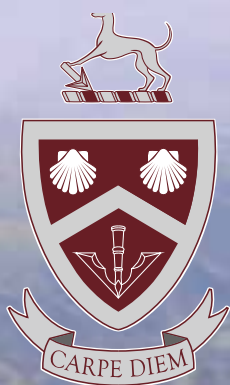

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PRETORIA BOYS HIGH



An English-medium boys' school with 1 500 pupils, Pretoria Boys High is one of the great South African schools boasting outstanding grounds and buildings. In the 1880s the government of the Republic of South Africa built a Staatsmodelskool - the building was changed into a prison and at this time Sir Winston Churchill was imprisoned there. It was later renamed Pretoria Boys High School and became the first 'Milner' school in the Transvaal, making it one of the oldest schools in the province. Today, the school can field 30 rugby teams on any given day and has a proud tradition, believing in participation rather than exclusivity. Rugby has been played at the school for over 100 years - with some notable players including Springbok captain John Smit, Robbie Brink, Brian Liebenberg and Chiliboy Ralepelle.

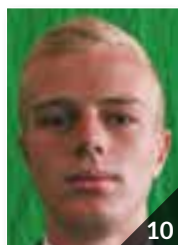

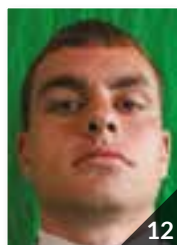

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SELBORNE COLLEGE



Selborne celebrates its 150th Jubilee this year, a proud and historic moment. In the modern era old boys Keith Andrews, Mark Andrews, Andre Vos and Brent Russell have represented South Africa at rugby, while Springboks of earlier times were Bernard Duffy (1928), Innes Froneman (1933), Andre de Wet (1969) and Raymond Carlson (1972). Currently, a healthy crop of Old Selbornians represent SA Schools U19, SA U21 and various Currie Cup sides.

RUGBY WORLD CUP 2023

The Springboks will return as defending champions to Rugby World Cup in France next year where, together with New Zealand, they are the only teams to have won RWC on three occasions.

At the 2023 draw which took place in Paris during December 2021, South Africa is in Pool B, and will face Ireland, Scotland, Asia/Pacific 1 and Europe 2 in the pool games.

Last month Spain became the Europe 2 qualifier in Pool B; with a 33-28 win against Portugal in Madrid. It capped a stunning turnaround for Los Leones, who began their RWC 2023 qualification campaign with three successive defeats at the start of last season's Rugby Europe Championship. Spain's last tournament appearance was at RWC 1999, where they were also drawn alongside South Africa and Scotland.

Other pool draws for RWC 2023 are:

Pool A - New Zealand, France, Italy, Americas 1, Africa 1

Pool C - Wales, Australia, Fiji, Europe 1, Final Qualifier winner

Pool D - England, Japan, Argentina, Oceania 1, Americas 2

The Springbok's opening pool game will be against Scotland in Marseille on 10 September 2023; followed by Spain on 17 September in Bordeaux; Ireland on 23 September in Saint-Denis; and the Asia/Pacific 1 qualifier on 1 October in Marseille.

The Springboks missed the first two RWC tournaments due to exclusion from international sport during the apartheid era. As hosts in 1995, they united the country with victory against the All Blacks. They then went on to lift the Webb Ellis Cup again in 2007 and 2019, with England the beaten team on both occasions.

With three titles, one runner-up finish and 49 wins to their name, New Zealand is the most successful team in RWC history. The All Blacks lifted the trophy as hosts in 1987 and 2011 and then again in 2015, becoming the first nation to win back-to-back Rugby World Cups. New Zealand took their record run of consecutive wins in the tournament to 18 in Japan in 2019 and were on course for an unprecedented consecutive treble of RWC titles, until England defeated them at the semi-final stage.

Ticket sales for next year's event have already opened. Packs, which include several matches, are now available, with single ticket sales opening in September.
