I pay for my child to learn to deal with disappointment when he doesn't get that try he hoped for, or when he dropped the ball despite having practiced catching a thousand times. I pay for my son to learn to get up after every disappointment and find the determination to do his best again and again. I pay for my son to learn that it takes hours and hours of hard work and practice to create a champion, and that success does not happen overnight. I pay so that my son can be on the pitch instead of in front of a screen. I could go on but, to be short, I don't pay for rugby; I pay for the opportunities that rugby provides my child to develop attributes that will serve him well throughout his life and give him the opportunity to bless the lives of others. I think it is a great investment."

It is our collective responsibility to facilitate rugby development and transformation at this critically important stage in rugby. This festival provides the platform for the growth of rugby in South Africa through transformation and development of the game.

DALE COLLEGE - Situated in King William's Town, it was established in 1861 and took on its current name in 1877 after Cape Colony superintendent-general of education Sir Langham Dale. Rugby was first played at Dale in 1880, but at that time the sport was not as popular as soccer. In 1891 and 1892, Dale played its first rugby matches against Queen's College and Selborne College respectively - winning both. Rugby was firmly established at the school in 1911 when the famous red and black colours were adopted, and have been worn ever since. Well known Old Dalians include: HO de Villiers, Bjorn Basson and Bandise Maku. In 2014 Tera Mtembu took over captaincy of the Sharks from fellow Old Dalian Keegan Daniel.

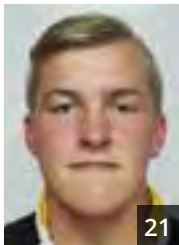

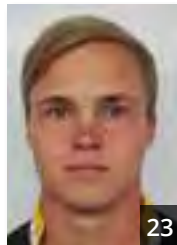

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GLENWOOD - From humble beginnings with just 26 boys in 1910, Glenwood has grown to become a leading school in South Africa. Rugby was introduced from the start, but initially Glenwood struggled to be competitive against more established schools. After WW11 the school began to win more regularly against its traditional rivals and, since 1950, Glenwood has had a winning record against many KZN schools. The school fields 30 rugby teams each weekend and has produced over 150 international sportsmen, including 7 rugby Springboks, nearly 50 Natal/Sharks players, 8 SA Schools' caps and over 170 KZN Schools' caps. In 2016 10 players were selected for the KZN Craven Week team; and in 2014 three players were chosen for SA Schools.

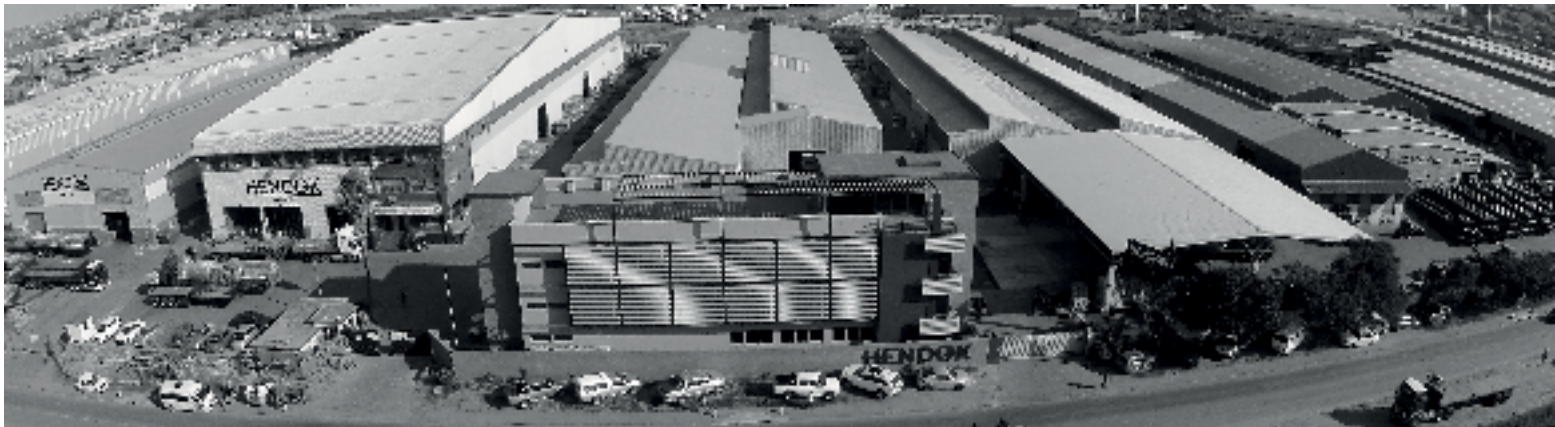

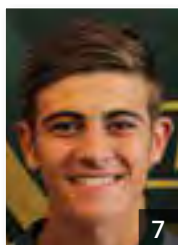

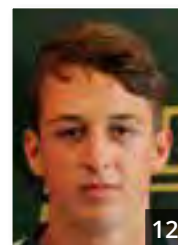

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LEVELLING THE PLAYING FIELD

The Stott, Kearsney College's famous 1st XV rugby field, where all Standard Bank Kearsney Easter Rugby Festival matches are played, sees more action in a rugby season than does Kings Park's main field. Ensuring that it looks magnificent, while being able to stand up to the wear and tear of studded boots and hefty forwards, is no mean feat.

The preparation of The Stott to ensure it is in optimal condition for the festival and rugby season is a year-long undertaking. The starting point is a heavy cutting of the grass before the season begins, then light daily trims, with regular soil samples being taken to the laboratory to assist with fertiliser choices and quantities, and daily watering using grey water.

Together with 19 ground staff, Ayanda Peter, Kearsney's Chief Groundsman, tends to and nurtures the field as though it were his fourth child. "Getting it perfect for the festival is important to me. We receive many positive compliments about the condition and we have to maintain our reputation," he says.

After 15 years tending the pitch at St George's Park Cricket Ground in Port Elizabeth, Ayanda is an expert groundsman and takes great pride in his work. Ayanda came to Kearsney in 2010, a place he says has changed his life.

Heading up the school's Facilities and Projects Department is Andrew Bretherton, a former assistant groundsman at Newlands in Cape Town, a United Cricket Board-appointed Coca-Cola Khaya Majola Cricket Week umpire and a schools' provincial cricket selector. Andrew has extensive experience in managing large scale school events, including last year's Coca-Cola Craven and Academy Weeks and the U16 Khaya Majola Week, which were hosted at Kearsney, as well as U15 rugby and cricket festivals at Paarl Boys High.

Andrew maintains a staff of 87 grounds, admin, security and cleaning staff, as well as drivers; all primed to ensure the nearly 400 players and their support staff, and the anticipated 12 000-plus spectators, have a memorable experience at the Standard Bank Kearsney Easter Rugby Festival.

The development programme started in 1992 with six high schools from the Coloured community in Durban and has now grown to approximately 700 high and primary schools throughout the province.

The programme provides an opportunity for boys and girls from previously disadvantaged communities, including Umlazi, Inanda, Woodlands, Edendale, Kokstad, Gamalakhe, Ulundi, Ezikhaweni, Bergville and Osizweni to learn about and play the game.

The team chosen to participate at the Kearsney Easter Rugby Festival this year was selected at the KZN Rugby Union's Talent Identification Tournament held in Richards Bay at Richards Bay High School last year. The boys have undergone extensive training at camps organised and run by the KZNRU Development Department, The Sharks and with coaches appointed from the communities.

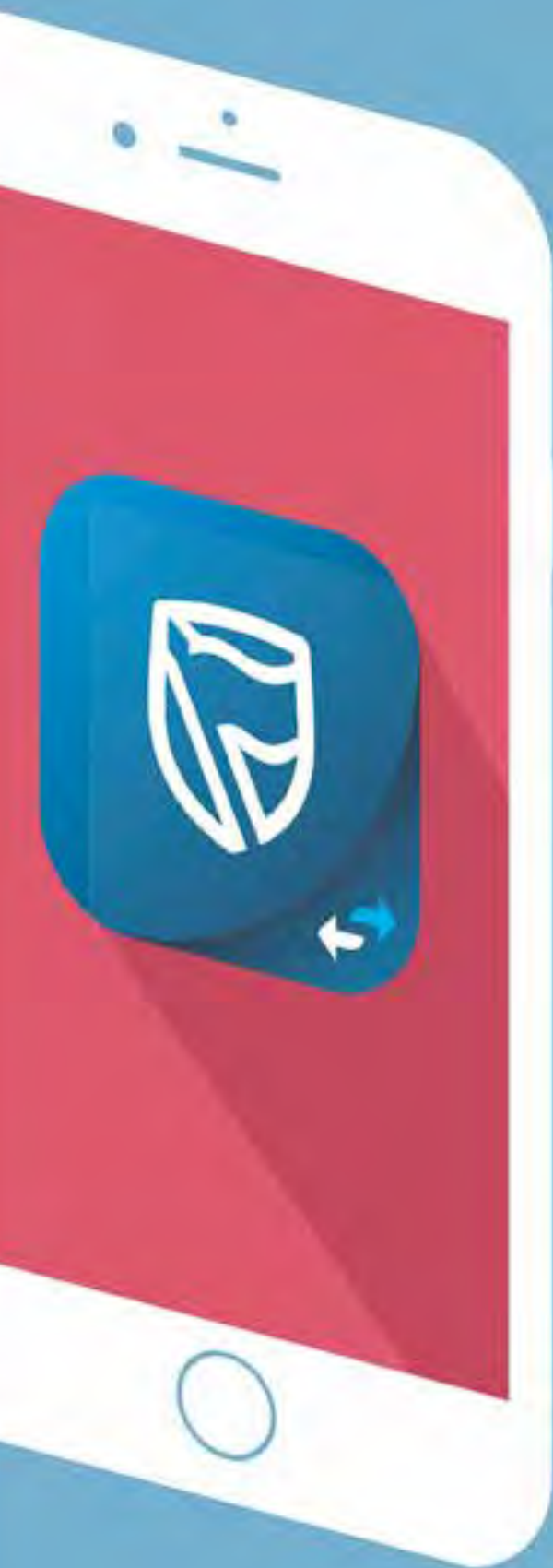
