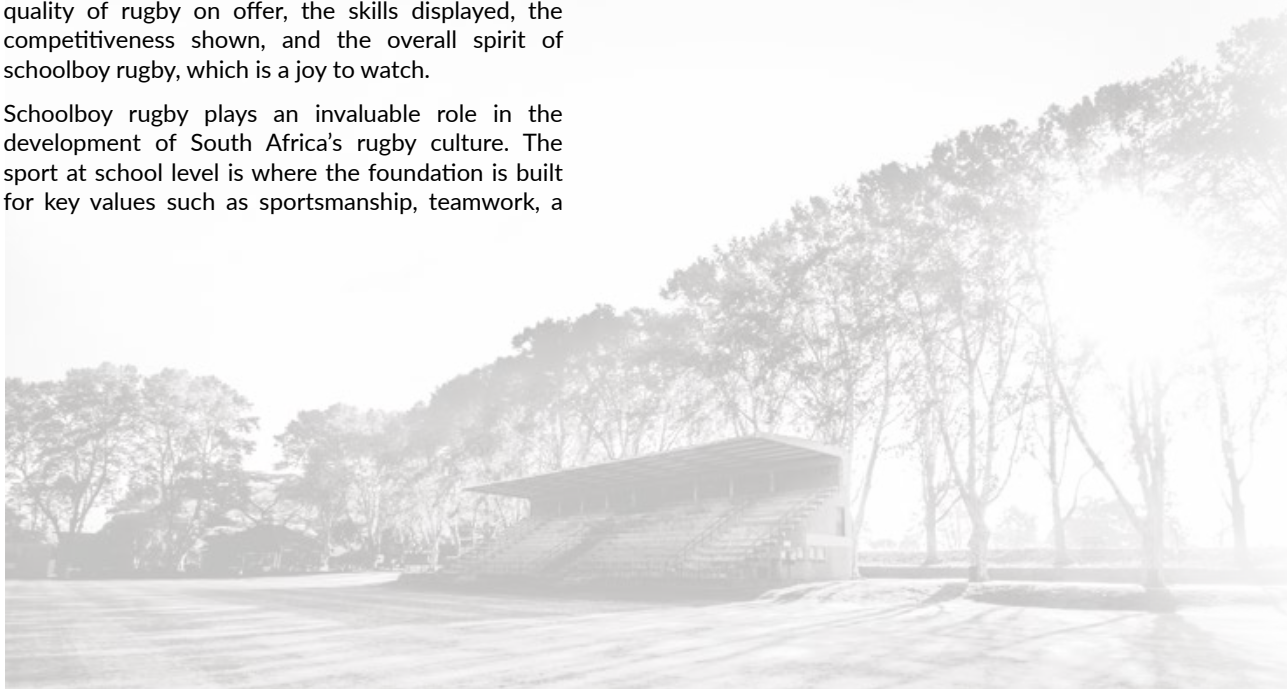

DHS began playing rugby in 1910 when Maritzburg College old boy AS Langley became headmaster and banned soccer, forcing all boys to play rugby. DHS has produced some notable rugby legends, including Skonk Nicholson and Springboks Neville Todd (1928), Andrew Aitken (1997), BJ Botha (2006) and Alistair Hargreaves (2009). Several players have represented other countries: Greg Rawlinson (New Zealand), Antonie Claassen (France), Graham Downes (USA), Matt Alexander (USA), Wynston Cameron-Dow (Germany) and Senzo Ngubane (Germany). Provincial players include Skonk Nicholson, Jody Jenneker, John Slade, Luzuko Vulindlu, Garth Williamson, Greg Hamilton, Anton Bresler, former DHS 1st XV coach Scott Mathie and, more recently, Phendulani Buthelezi, Celimpilo Gumede and Sanele Nohamba.

BOKS ON THE RIGHT PATH HEADING INTO A WORLD CUP YEAR

Of all the contenders for the World Cup, the Springboks finished 2022 with the biggest smile and they look like they have got their timing right for the Big One in France in September.



Now that the dust has settled on the 2022 international season, we can take a considered look at the rugby landscape ahead of this year's World Cup and, for my money, the Springboks have made more progress up rugby's Everest than their rivals.

Before a ball was kicked on the first weekend last November, Ireland and France were rated the best contenders for the Webb Ellis Cup, with New Zealand not far off them; England were breathing down the necks of the Kiwis and the Springboks and Wallabies were not doing well at the bookies.

Four weekends of international rugby later, it looked a little different. Ireland and France are still right up there but they no longer look unbeatable.

There has been so much hype about both sides, and deservedly so, but the gloss has come off their ambitions, and it is not a coincidence that the Boks made both very uneasy when losing narrowly to them.

Winning the World Cup is all about timing. You want to be firmly on an upward curve when you arrive at the event. How often have we seen the All Blacks play magnificent rugby in the years building up to the World Cup only to be flat at the actual event...?

Did Ireland peak as a side when they won that series in New Zealand in July? And then France have been hyped to the rafters but they almost lost at home to Australia, who also gave Ireland a fright.

New Zealand looked good in parts but then damaged

so much of their recovering confidence when they imploded against England at Twickenham. The Kiwis went home questioning themselves all over again as they did after a roller coaster Rugby Championship.

This might be a good thing for the All Blacks because for once they will not go to the World Cup as favourites.

Speaking of England, they have been dreadful and Eddie Jones has been fired to join Wales coach Wayne Pivac on the scrap heap (he has been replaced by Warren Gatland).

This brings me to the Springboks. An important thing to remember about the Boks is that they lost a year of rugby to lockdown (2020) when the other teams in the world were playing, and so when they resumed last year, against the Lions, they kept the same game plan that had won the World Cup.

There was no time for experimentation last year but that happened in 2022. As much as Bok fans hate to lose, the defeats in 2022 will be forgotten if the Webb Ellis Cup comes home with the Boks because they grew their depth and adapted their playing style in the year before France 2023.

The manner in which the Boks dispatched Italy and England in their last two tour games was a thing of beauty. The Boks continue to have a brawny pack and a just as muscular bomb squad but they now have playmakers at 10 and 15 and exquisite finishers out wide, and that puts them on the path to becoming the perfect rugby team.



DR EG JANSEN

A physical brand of rugby is played at this Boksburg school which prides itself on being one of the toughest East Rand sides, regularly taking on the biggest schools in Gauteng. Hoërskool Dr EG Jansen has a long and illustrious rugby history, having been the Valke league champions on multiple occasions, as well as winning the coveted Nupower and Beeld trophies in 2013. It has a rich rugby history, with players like Francois Uys (Free State), Louis Ludick (Sharks), Kevin Buys (Lions) and Ruaan Lerm (Lions and EP Kings), Gunter Smuts (Lions), JP du Preez (Cheetahs and Sale Sharks) and Erich Cronje (Zebre) having gone through its ranks. In addition, the school has many Craven Week players on a consistent basis, with old boys Hendré Stassen (Bulls) and Nico Peyper (Bulls) being awarded SA Schools colours in 2015.

HARTPURY COLLEGE

GLOUCESTERSHIRE

This year Kearsney College is delighted to be hosting Hartpury College from the United Kingdom, an institution known for its development of outstanding rugby players, with many of its former students having progressed to playing at the highest levels of the game.

Current Hartpury College graduates playing in Europe's top divisions include Ellis Genge (Bristol, England), Harry Randall (Bristol, England), Daff Jenkins (Exeter, Wales), Stephen Varney (Gloucester, Italy), Lewis Ludlow (Gloucester, England), Sebastien Negri (Benetton, Italy), with four former students having represented the British and Irish Lions in their last two tours (Louis Rees-Zammit, Ross Moriarty, Jonny Hill and Alex Cuthbert) – a significant number of top players considering the academy was established less than two decades ago.

Based in the heart of Gloucestershire, Hartpury University and College is set in a vibrant 360-hectare estate offering world-renowned facilities. It was established after World War II as an agricultural education centre with only 50 students.

Today it has over 4 500 registered students at the College and University and, aside from its distinguished rugby academy, has sports academies for football, modern pentathlon, equine, rowing, netball and golf. It hosts Hartpury University RFC, which has an association with the professional club Gloucester Rugby, and Gloucester-Hartpury Women RFC.

The institution's symbol of an acorn reflects the beautiful countryside which surrounds the campus, as well as signifying the potential that lies within us all. Hartpury asserts to provide everything the acorn will need to grow - the best facilities, the best staff and the

best environment to support their students' ability to grow strong.

The College is proud to have a historic Victorian bee shelter on its grounds. This structure, known as a bee bole, is a listed building. Set in south west England, the county comprises part of the Cotswold Hills, part of the flat fertile valley of the River Severn and the entire Forest of Dean. Agriculture is the largest industry sector of employment in Gloucestershire, well supported by a good climate and water availability. The region is dominated by beef cattle, dairy and non-cereal broad acre crops.

The county has been the setting for a number of high-profile movies, including the Bond film 'Die Another Day' and the Harry Potter films.

There are also two well-known literary accounts of childhood in rural Gloucestershire in the early 20th century - Laurie Lee's 'Cider With Rosie' and Winifred Foley's 'A Child in the Forest'. Part of Mrs Craik's novel 'John Halifax, Gentleman' is set in Enderley, a thinly disguised Amberley, and Nortonbury, recognisable as Tewkesbury.

A foodie's paradise, Gloucestershire boasts world-renowned produce including Double Gloucester cheese and Gloucestershire Old Spot pork!



This is Hartpury College's third tour to South Africa. In 2018 they attended the World Schools Festival (WSF) at Paarl Boys High and in 2019 at Paul Roos Gimnasium in Stellenbosch.

At the first festival they beat Affies 26-15 and lost to Grey College 0-60; the Affies win making them the only international side to beat a South African team at that festival.

The following year, at the 2019 WSF, they lost 21-31 to Hoërskool Monument and 12-41 to Paarl Gimnasium.

Hartpury will be hungry for a successful 2023 tour. They will play Hoërskool Dr EG Jansen, Westville Boys' High and hosts Kearsney College for the final fixture of the festival.





HARTPURY COLLEGE

Formed in 2004, Hartpury College's Men's Rugby Academy is renowned for producing international players and winning national schoolboy titles. The College side has won the National ACE League final 10 times in the last 12 years, with more than 200 Hartpury students having gained international caps or signed professional contracts around the world. In 2020, Hartpury College was named as the best in the world at producing professional rugby players in a study by NextGenXV, finding that 38 currently contracted players had attended Hartpury, including 29 in the Premiership - the top division in England. This figure was matched only by Grey College. Hartpury's rugby pathway means students can play for Hartpury College and then Hartpury University and its RFU Championship side Hartpury University RFC.

MONNAS (HOËRSKOOI MONUMENT)

Hoërskool Monument has a rich and proud history. It was established in 1921 in Krugersdorp, with just 48 pupils and three staff members; and now boasts 1 600 learners and 18 rugby teams. The first school rugby match was played in 1922 against Krugersdorp High School. 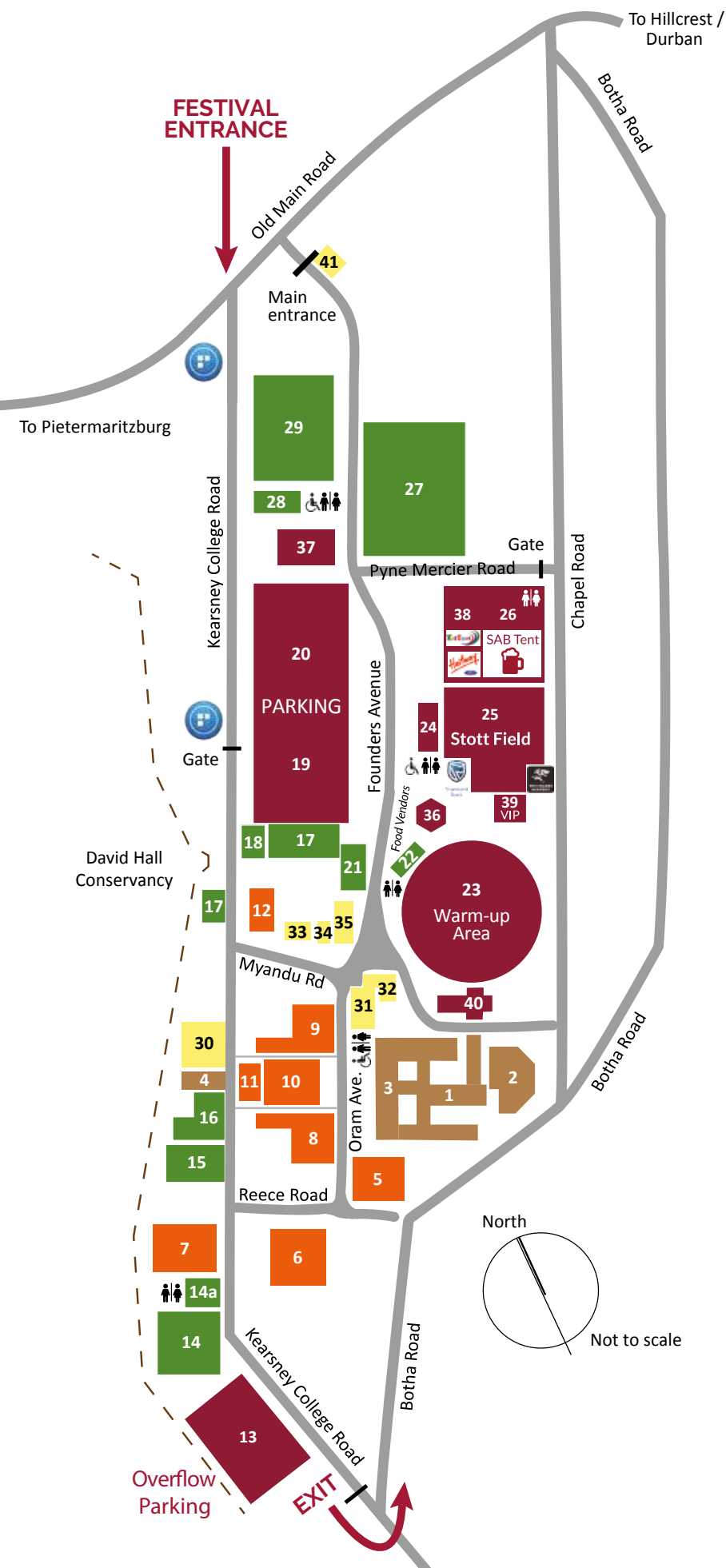
